The Schools Challenge

Here's how to enter:

Each student enterprise group should submit a copy of their Evaluation Sheet (the final student activity) with a concise PowerPoint presentation (a maximum of 10 slides) or a video or Word document telling us about their enterprising product/service.

Presentations can include:

- An introduction to the enterprise team and school
- The steps taken to make your enterprise work
- Examples of the promotional materials you produced
- Any quotes from your customers
- Photos/video footage taken on the day
- Final amount donated to the Prince's Trust
- What you learned and what you enjoyed!

The judges will be looking for:

- The sum of money raised
- Originality of idea
- Creativity in marketing campaign
- Quality of presentation

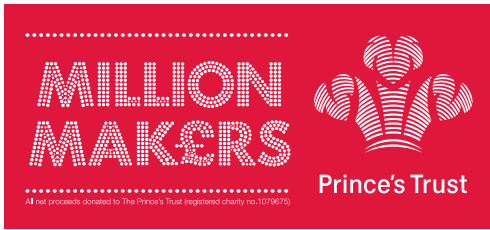

Terms & Conditions for Million Makers: The Schools Challenge competition

1. Promoter: The Prince's Trust (Head Office), 18 Park Square East, London NW1 4LH
2. The 'Million Makers: The Schools Challenge' competition, outlined on the Million Makers: The Schools Challenge website and CD-Rom as part of the KS3 Million Makers: The Schools Challenge resources, is open to students attending state and/or grant maintained schools in England, Wales and Northern Ireland aged 11 – 14 years or in school year groups 7,8 and 9.
3. Competition is not open to employees of the Promoter or their direct family members, Promoter's competition partners or anyone professionally connected to the competition.
4. Promoter reserves the right to exclude any entrant at any time.
5. All entrants must obtain consent of a parent/guardian prior to entering the competition.
6. Entry to the competition and acceptance of the prize gives The Prince's Trust permission to use any winners' names and school name for promotional purposes without additional payment. The Prince's Trust does not have to contact any entrant again to gain this permission. We will not pass these details to any other organisation except for the purposes of running this competition.
7. All entries may also be used as case studies by The Prince's Trust.
8. Only winners will be contacted personally by Promoter and all winners must respond to Promoter within two weeks of notification of their winning entry (unless otherwise stated). If no response is received, Promoter reserves the right to select other winners.
9. Promoter accepts no responsibility for late, damaged, invalid or lost entries. Proof of entry, stamp or uploading is not proof of receipt.
10. The judges' decision is final in every situation. No correspondence will be entered into.
11. By entering, entrants will be deemed to have accepted the competition terms & conditions and to agree to be bound by them.
12. Prizes are as stated, there is no cash alternative. The Prince's Trust reserves the right to change any prize in the event of unforeseen circumstances.
13. Personal information about winners and/or entrants will be shared with The Prince's Trust to the extent necessary for prizes to be delivered to the winners and used in accordance with the Prince's Trust's Privacy Policy. We take appropriate measures to safeguard the integrity and confidentiality of data we hold from unauthorised access and will retain any personal information we obtain only for as long as we need it. 14. Million Makers: The Schools Challenge competition launches on 01 May 2009 and will close for the summer term on 30/09/2009 and in autumn term on 18/12/2009.
15. Entrants are required to complete in full the competition entry form available on the Million Makers: The Schools Challenge website and CD-Rom as part of the KS3 Million Makers: The Schools Challenge resources. School details should be included and contact details for the sponsor teacher or staff member. Each individual pupil in the group should be listed. School approval is required for groups entry, failure to obtain such approval will result in disqualification and forfeiting of any prize awarded.
16. School/entrants must pay postage.
17. The sponsor teacher/staff of the finalists will be contacted and if they have not been asked to sponsor an entry that entry is then void.
18. Each winning team of five students will need a teacher to escort them to the event
19. The judging period for each competition shall take place in the six weeks following each closing date and the winning group will be notified through their sponsor teacher/ staff member.
20. The winning group will be used for publicity and promotion. Each individual winner will be required to submit the permission forms required as condition of entry to the Promoter. By entering this competition entrants accept this criterion. Promoter reserves the right to contact the sponsor teacher to verify that such permission has been given.
21. Winners will be required to submit the written consent of their parent/guardian to the sponsor teacher/staff after being notified by the promoter. Promoter reserves the right to contact the sponsor teacher/staff to verify that such consent has been given.
22. All other entries not selected as the winning group will be destroyed after six months of the winners being announced. No competition entries will be returned and all submitted entries shall become the property of The Prince's Trust.
23. Entrants (individual pupils) are only eligible to enter once.
24. Entrants are not required to purchase any equipment to enter.
25. The Promoter does not accept any liability for any loss or damage whatsoever (including but not limited to indirect or consequential loss) or for any accident or injury or death whilst practicing for presentation, accepting or using any prize or otherwise relating to either prize competition or prizes offered. The Promoter is not seeking to exclude liability for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Promoter nor any liability for losses arising from any fraudulent representation of the Promoter. All reasonable steps to protect safety should be undertaken and entrants are required to provide details of a teacher to sponsor their entry. This teacher is responsible for entrant's safety.

 - The winning groups (a maximum of five students per group) will receive an invitation to a Prince's Trust VIP event, likely to be held in London, England.
 - The Promoter will absorb travel expenses and accommodation costs if needed.
 - Any other costs and expenses not specifically referred to above are excluded and are the responsibility of the winner, sponsor teacher and/or winning school.
